2018 cards expired on the 31st of DEC. You must have a 2019 card to be served or be signed in as a guest. We are over 80% now, so please renew if you haven't and try to sign up one new member.

Please include your branch of service with your renewal payment.

You can renew online by visiting **www.legion.org/renew.** You can also register for the Automatic Annual Renewal Program. The Post cannot process credit card payments-we send them to Department. You must include your **credit card number and expiration date.**

You can only Pay Up For Life online and the \$100 discount is still in effect. Just visit legion.org, search for PUFL offer.

2019 dues are \$40 for ages 59 and younger (\$35 for Early Bird from July until Veterans Day), \$32 for 60 and older. Our 3-year renewals are \$100 for 59 and younger and \$90 for 60 and older. If you pay online to national or by credit card, you will be charged \$40-national only recognizes our official dues. You can only get discounted rates by paying \$32/\$35 to the Post utilizing the renewal notice.

Customer Consideration: Please **do not mover other customer's drinks, money or property at the bar** as this causes issues and accusations. If you want their seat, please ask them or ask the bartender to ask them.

We hold a **Queen of Hearts** drawing every Thursday. Tickets are \$1 each or 6 for \$5. Drawing is at 8 PM. You must be present, be a **2018 regular member of a VSO (no associate/honorary member-ships accepted) & pick the Queen of Hearts to win**. The pot to be shared in our 5th fundraiser is over \$3,400.

DO NOT USE Handicap parking spaces for overnight parking.

All kitchen workers (lunches, Friday steak crews, Saturday dinners, Monday/Tuesday sandwich nights) are volunteers who depend on tips. Please remember to tip the kitchen workers.

We have **Bingo on Monday nights** from 6:30 to 8:30 and **have a progressive lucky ball jackpot. The Riders are serving burgers, hot dogs, French fries and specials.** We conduct Bingo every Tuesday and Thursday at 2 PM with a progressive lucky ball jackpot. **Riders Wing Night is Thursday the 21st, and there will be Karaoke.**

MEAL SERVICE

We ask your cooperation in not bringing in or ordering outside food during times someone is serving food. Remember, they are donating their time and effort to prepare, serve and clean up. The meals are fund raisers for our various programs. If you do not wish to buy the meal, please eat before you come to the Post or wait until the meal is done. <u>Please do not bring in your own</u> snacks, sodas, water, or any item we sell at the bar at any time.

When you sign in a guest, that guest must leave when you leave.

Steak Bingo is conducted at 6 PM every Friday steak night. Eight games are conducted-7 for steaks and 1 for road kill (ribs).

As a reminder, the bartenders' priority is serving drinks to customers at the bar and in the line. If you wish to be served, use the waitress station-do not stand at the end of the bar or between people sitting at the bar. If you want to redeem or buy a ticket for any machine, you will have to wait until the bartender finishes with drinks. The Post has 72 hours to pay out on the machines and the bartenders cannot pay tickets of \$500 or more or prior day tickets. You are limited to redeeming \$1,000 a day. If the bartender runs out of money, you may have to return later. The Manager will only redeem tickets Monday through Friday during normal business hours.

number with newly assigned ID numbers as your identification. The ID number consists of a unique combi-nation of 11 letters and numbers. The cards are free and scammers are already posing as Medicare representatives and calling or emailing beneficiaries demanding a processing fee to issue them. Other fraudsters are telling beneficiaries that they are owed a refund from transactions on their old card, then asking for bank account information to process the reimbursement. Medicare will never ask an enrollee for bank account numbers, and no refunds are owed. Scammers are also asking for payments to replace cards that may be lost. Mailing the new cards to members is a yearlong process that began in May 2018. To learn more about when your card will arrive, go to Medicare.gov/NewCard.

Membership Food for Thought

You have probably heard the phrase "Membership is the lifeblood of the organization" many times. It truly is. The larger the membership of the organization, the greater our ability to lobby Congress on behalf of veterans. The portion of your dues that is kept here locally helps, but in no way covers the cost of operating and maintaining the building, paying the bills or funding our many programs. Your patronage of the canteen produces the working capital to keep the doors open. The various fundraising projects by our Family organization funds the many programs, particularly children & youth, that we support every year. There are a number of big ticket items that need attention, which is why we activated the building fund. Your support with your time and donations help achieve these goals.

1973 Fire at the National Personnel Records Center in St. Louis

The fire occurred on July 12, 1973, and destroyed about 80% of the records for Army personnel discharged between November 1, 1912, and January 1, 1960; and about 75% of the records for Air Force personnel with surnames from Hubbard thru "Z" discharged between September 25, 1947, and January 1, 1964. Center employees cannot determine for certain the records that were burned because millions of records (especially medical records) had been withdrawn from all three blocks and lent to the VA prior to the fire. One should not assume their record was burned. If the record was burned, the Veteran may submit photocopies of documents they possess to the NPRC

Proposed Membership Eligibility Change

At the Fall NEC meeting, two resolutions were passed proposing changes to the eligibility requirements. As we are a Congressionally chartered wartime veterans service organization, Congress controls our eligibility periods. There have been 12 combat operations since WW II and Congress has authorized 5 of them: Korea, Vietnam, Lebanon/Grenada, Panama and the Gulf War/War on Terror. Resolution 1 details the other 7 periods and petitions Congress to authorize them. Should that happen, Resolution 2 would implement the additional periods. Effectively, this proposal would result in eligibility for The American Legion to be continuous from December 7, 1942, to the cessation of hostilities on a date to be determined by Congress. The National Staff in DC is pursuing this with Congress. A Legislative Alert will be issued should a bill be brought to a vote, so please respond when received. For those not on the Legislative Alert list, visit www.legion.org and sign up. You would then receive alerts when votes involving veterans issues are scheduled and a proposed message that would go to both Senators and your Representative.
