Commander's Corner

Good day everyone, It is sure nice to be back open and sharing in the comradery with our Post family members. Happily, I see our attendance growing to pre-COVID virus numbers for Steak Night, Bingo, etc. If you have not been back to our Post since the shut-down please consider stopping in. You can find an up-to-date calendar of events on our Facebook page: alpost316. Now for the bad news, while attendance at the Post is up, volunteerism in down. It seems that regardless of the Legion family team it is a struggle to find enough volunteers to man the kitchen. I want to thank all those who have stepped up to help out, whether it is Auxiliary members helping out the Legion team or Legionaries helping out the Auxiliary or Sons or Riders it does not matter, it is noticed and appreciated, thank you.

Speaking of attendance, we have not been able to conduct any Legion business for the past 2 months because we have not had enough members to make a quorum. We only need 10 out of our 800 plus members to show up for the General Assembly meeting and sadly we cannot get enough for a quorum. People let that sink in for a moment, we have over 800 members and not even 10 members will give an hour of their life to attend the Post monthly meeting! So why is it important for our members to attend the meeting? Because our Post is member controlled, it takes a vote from membership to approve all business, except for regularly scheduled payments i.e. bar staff compensation, utilities, insurance, bar, and kitchen supplies, etc. All other expenditures must be approved by the membership at our monthly meetings. Acceptance of new and transferring members requires a vote from membership. The election of new officers requires a vote. Basically, all new business requires a vote from membership prior to it being authorized except for funding for emergencies. An example of the most recent emergency repair would be the need of a plumber to fix urinal issues and the replacement of the two beer coolers behind the bar. Other than emergencies, everything else requires a vote from you before it can be approved. Remember, the Executive Board can only make a recommendation, it takes a vote from membership before a motion is approved or disapproved.

We need you to take an active role in the management of your Post. If you do not attend the meetings your voice is not heard and your vote is not counted. An example of an item that came before the assembly last month was whether to allow our Post to become a testing site for the COVID virus. There was not a quorum so there was not a vote. However there was discussion by those in attendance who supported allowing our post to be a testing site and there were those who opposed our Post to being a testing site for COVID, just as there were a few who were undecided.

We have new members and transferring members who have been waiting for a vote to accept them as members in good standing into our Post. Question, how would you feel if your membership was in limbo for 60 or possibly even 90 days because we continue to not have a quorum? Personally, I would probably look for another Post to join if it were me!!! We have a gentleman who has volunteered to step up to fill our vacant 2nd Vice position who has been waiting for 2 months. We have a gentleman who has applied for membership who wants to fill our vacant Service Officers position, again waiting on a quorum. We need members to attend the monthly meeting who will hear, discuss, and vote on Post business. Remember the story of everybody, nobody, somebody, and anybody.... who are you? Our next General Assembly meeting will be on Monday October 12th at 8:00 pm. I need you there, our Post needs you there and our members need you there so we can conduct the business of our Post. As stated above at our next meeting we will be voting on : New membership, nomination of officers, Post expenditures and whether to allow our Post to become a COVID virus testing site among other items, so please make plans to attend. DO NOT USE Handicap parking spaces for overnight parking.

All kitchen workers (lunches, Friday steak crews, Saturday dinners, Monday/Tuesday sandwich nights) are volunteers who depend on tips. Please remember to tip the kitchen workers.

Bingo is on Monday nights at 6:30 and has a progressive lucky ball jackpot. The Riders serve a variety of different items now. Tuesday and Thursday Bingo is at 2 PM with a progressive lucky ball jackpot and Friday Bingo is at 2 PM with a progressive lucky ball jackpot. Riders Wing Night is Thursday the 15th.

Pass the Trash is Wednesday night at 7 PM. Come early to get a seat at the bar. If you would like to deal, please let Liz know.

Red shirt Friday drink specials are served every Friday. You must be wearing a **RED** shirt to get the special.

Wear NASCAR clothes during NASCAR season and NFL gear during NFL season for drink specials.

We ask your cooperation in not bringing in or ordering outside food during times someone is serving food. Remember, they are donating their time and effort to prepare, serve and clean up. The meals are fund raisers for our various programs. If you do not wish to buy the meal, please eat before you come to the Post or wait until the meal is done. Please do not bring in your own snacks, sodas, water, or any item we sell at the bar at any time. When ordering food from outside the Post, please be sure to order plates and cutlery if needed. We will be locking the storage room at 6:00 PM nightly and on the weekends.

When you sign in a guest, that guest must leave when you leave.

Steak Bingo is conducted at 6 PM every Friday steak night. Eight games are conducted-7 for steaks and 1 for road kill (ribs).

As a reminder, the bartenders' priority is serving drinks to customers at the bar and in the line. If you wish to be served, use the waitress stationdo not stand at the end of the bar or between people sitting at the bar. If you want to redeem or buy a ticket for any machine, you will have to wait until the bartender finishes with drinks. The Post has 72 hours to pay out on the machines and the bartenders cannot pay tickets of \$500 or more, or prior day tickets. You are limited to redeeming \$1,000 a day. If the bartender runs out of money, you may have to return later. The Manager will only redeem tickets Monday through Friday during

COVID-19

FYI, symptoms of COVID-19 are fever, cough and shortness of breath. Symptoms may appear in as few as 2 days or as many as 14 days following exposure. It spreads from person to person through small droplets from the nose or mouth, including when an individual coughs or sneezes. These droplets may land on objects and surfaces. Other people may contract it by touching these objects and surfaces, then touching their eyes, nose or mouth. Most people recover from it without needing special treatment. The elderly and those with underlying medical problems like high blood pressure, heart problems and diabetes are more likely to develop serious illness. There is currently no vaccine to prevent it. The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to it.

Project Vet Relief (PVR)

An emergency program between PVR and the Florida Veterans Foundation has been established to address critical needs of Florida Veterans that face a crisis due to COVID-19. A team of PVR staff will take requests and have Service Officers or PVR advocates conduct interviews of applicants. The Florida Veterans Foundation will establish a statewide donation plat-form and forward funds as they are received to PVR. A condensed application form is available on their websites.

Existing guidelines: 1. Be a Veteran, Active Duty, or Immediate Family Member (spouse, legal guardian, child). 2. Acceptable discharges: Honorable or General under Honorable conditions. 3. Florida resident for a minimum of 120 days. 4. Show sustainability-balance of income and expenses. 5. Experiencing an unforeseeable emergency. 6. Provided for necessities: shelter, utilities, food (in the form of a gift card), and some transportation and medical expenses. 7. Funds are granted one-time annually per household.

Additional process for COVID-19: 1. Applicants are experienceing loss of income-must show proof via pay stubs or letter from employer. 2. Phone interview with local Vet Relief Advocate will be accepted for the safety of our volunteers. 3. To avoid depletion of funds, a monthly cap of financial assistance will be put in place.

First Coast Honor Flight is one of the newest Honor Flight Hubs serving Baker, Clay, Duval, Flagler, Nassau, Putnam and Saint Johns counties. They are seeking Veterans, Guardians, Volunteers and Donors as well as help spreading the word in the community. Their 131 hubs honor men and women who served during WW II, Korea and Vietnam as well as terminally ill Veterans from all wars. They provide an all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C., to visit the various war memorials including the WW II, Korean and Vietnam Memorials. Each Veteran will have a Guardian escort assigned who will travel with them to help make their visit more memorable and ensure their needs are met. There is a fee for Guardians (airline ticket, meals, bus, etc.). All of these forms are also available at the Post. They also have a Facebook Page which can be found by searching First Coast Honor Flight. VA Debt Relief

The VA announced it's commitment to extend debt relief to Veterans adversely affected by COVID-19 to the end of 2020 by suspending certain debt collection actions. VA is suspending all actions on Veteran debts under the jurisdiction of the Treasury Department. This includes suspension of collection action or extending repayment terms on preexisting VA debts, whichever the Veteran prefers. For benefit debts, contact the VA Debt Management Center at 800-827-0648. For health care debts, contact the Health Resource Center at 866-400-1238. Online, go to https://www.pay.gov for payments.

COVID-19 TRACING TEXT MESSAGE SCAM

Contact tracing is a powerful tool that helps stop the further spread of COVID-19, thus scammers abound. The process identifies those who have come in contact with someone who has tested positive and via text message, instructs them to quarantine and monitor their symptoms daily. Contact tracers work with an infected person to get the names and phone numbers for everyone they came in close contact with while possibly infectious. The first text message will be from the health department telling them they will get a call from a specific number. Scam tracers claiming to be affiliated with a state health department will call and ask for personal information like SSN, bank account information or a credit card numbers. Scammers may also include a link that redirects you to a fraudulent site. Clicking on the link may download software onto your device, giving scammers access to an array of your personal and financial information. Do not take the bait-ignore and delete these scam messages.
