2026 Membership Renewal

Our new dues on January 1, 2026 will be \$50, \$40 for 60 and older and \$45 for Early Birds; the 3-year rate will be \$130 for 59 and younger, \$120 for 60 and older. Currently, if you pay dues online, you will be charged our official dues rate of \$45. You can only get our senior dues rate of \$37 by using the renewal notice and mailing your \$37 to the Post. The same is true for the Early Bird rate for 59 and younger. If you pay 3-years online, you will be charged 3 X \$45 = \$135. You can only get the discount rates of \$105 for 60 and older/\$115 for 59 and younger by paying at the Post. Two things are important when you pay online: make sure you are paying for 2026 unless you are behind and want to catch up your years; and do not click on the \$25 or \$30 options. If you click on one of them, the system will make you a new member starting with one year and a new membership number and put you in the headquarters Post which is Orlando 400. Post 316 will lose you as a member and get no credit for your renewal. Please remember that you cannot pay your dues to the Post by credit card as we cannot process them. Use the ATM next to the East side exit.

Steak Night

Due to the continuing increase in cost of steak and salmon, prices increased in June. Steak dinners are now \$14, salmon dinners are \$11 and a combo is \$22.

Social Media Notice

The following notice was posted on the bulletin board, will be incorporated into the Post Regulations and is effective immediately. It reads: At a regular meeting of the General Assembly on Monday, October 14, 2024, the membership ruled that any negativity toward The American Legion Post 316, American Legion Auxiliary Unit 316, Sons of The American Legion Squadron 316, Riders Chapter 316, their officers or their members on Facebook or any other social media platform would lead to consideration of disciplinary action by the House Committee. 2026 Membership Cards

SAL membership cards are available and dues may be paid now. Renewals have been slow and we are currently at 30%. Help us reach 100% membership again this year.

Pearl Harbor Day Golf Tournament

The Tournament will be Saturday, Dec. 6. The base has increased our authorized foursomes to 18 this year, and we already have 11 teams signed up. Cost is \$90/golfer, \$360/foursome. Hole sponsors remains at \$50 per hole. We ask for your assistance at getting hole sponsors and donations. A number of companies and individuals donated last year and donations are tax deductible. American Leion Media

The American Legion Magazine ranked first in male readership loyalty among all US periodicals according to independent research. The Enews-letter program audience open rates have risen in 2025. The average open rate rose from 18.37% in 2021 to 28.635% in 2025. The 3-newsletter audience has grown in members from 861,000 in 2021 to 1.04 million in 2025. All American Legion social media platforms are continuously gaining followers. As of Oct. 1st, the national Facebook followers stood at 190,193; the national X-followers was at 121,276, the national Linked-In followers was at 54,178 and the national Instagram followers was at38,919. All of these channels have had consistent and continuous growth.

You can still pay 2025 dues, and the 2026 cards available. Dues remain the same as 2025 until January 1st when our dues will be as indicated on page 1. The renewal notice you receive has areas on the back to provide info on email address, phone number, date of birth, etc. <u>Please Note:</u> We cannot accept credit card payments as Department will not process them for us. Pay by check, money order or come in and pay cash.

You can create your own national membership account by visiting legion.org/ renew and follow the steps. You can also register for the Automatic Annual Renewal Program. You can only Pay Up For Life online and the \$100 discount is still in effect.

2026 Dues are \$45 for 59 and younger (\$40 during the Early Bird period until Veterans Day), \$37 for 60 and older (year-round). Our 3-year renewals are \$115 for 59 and younger and \$105 for 60 and older. If you pay online to national, you will be charged \$45-national only recognizes our official dues. If you pay 3-years online, you will be charged \$135. You can only get discounted rates by paying \$40/\$37 or \$115/\$105 the Post 3-year rates to the Post.

With receipts, up to \$50 can be reimbursed.

Lost & Found. If you are missing any item, like jackets, cell phones, car keys, etc., please see Liz.

Customer Consideration: Please do not move other customer's drinks, money or property at the bar as this causes issues and accusations. If you want their seat, please ask them or ask the bartender to ask them.

The Queen of Hearts contest needs volunteers on Friday nights for the drawing to be held at 8:00 PM. You must be present, be a 2024/25 regular member of a VSO (no associate members can play and no signed-in guests can play), have your membership card on you, & pick the Queen of Hearts to win. DO NOT USE Handicap parking spaces for overnight parking.

All kitchen workers (lunches, Friday steak crews, Saturday dinners, Monday meal nights) are volunteers who depend on tips. <u>Please</u> remember to tip them.

Monday Bingo is at 6:30 with a progressive lucky ball jackpot. The Riders serve a variety of different items, so the price varies based on your order. Tuesday and Thursday Bingo is at 2 PM with a progressive lucky ball jackpot.

Pass the Trash is back in action on Wednesdays at 7:30 PM. Thank you Patti Harrison. If you would like to deal, please let Liz know.

Red shirt Friday drink specials are served every Friday. You must be wearing a RED shirt to get the special. Wear official NASCAR shirts or official NFL shirts on Sunday and get the special.

We ask your cooperation in NOT bringing in or ordering outside food during times someone is serving food. Remember, they are donating their time and effort to prepare, serve and clean up. The meals are fund raisers for our various programs. If you do not wish to buy the meal, please eat before you come to the Post or wait until the meal is done. Please do not bring in your own snacks, sodas, water, or any item whether we sell them or not at the bar at any time. When ordering food from outside the Post, please be sure to order plates and cutlery if needed. We will be locking the storage room at 6:00 PM nightly and on the weekends.

When you sign in a guest, that guest must leave when you leave. Guests eligible to be members may only be signed in 4 times a month.

Steak Bingo is conducted by the 40/8 at 6:30 PM every Friday steak night. Eight games are conducted-7 for steaks and 1 for road kill.

As a reminder, the bartenders' priority is serving drinks to customers at the bar and in the line. If you wish to be served, use the waitress station-do not stand at the end of the bar or between people sitting at the bar. If you want to redeem or buy a ticket for any machine, you will have to wait until drinks are finished. The Post has 72 hours to pay out on the machines and the bartenders cannot pay tickets of \$599 or more, or prior day tickets. You are limited to redeeming \$1,000 a day. If the bartender runs out of money, you will have to return later. Please note: The Manager will only redeem tickets Monday through Friday during normal business hours. Seats at the games are for player only. Players are restricted to playing one game at a time.

Online Legion Account

To register in MyLegion.org, you must have your email attached to your name in the online National roster. If it is not in your profile, the account you establish will be a non-Legion account. See 1st Vice Clarence Hill if you are not sure. To establish the account, go to mylegion.org and select "Register." Enter the email in the Register window and click next. Then follow the prompts. After you create your password, the email must be verified. The system will send you a one time password (OTP) to verify it. Once your account is established, click on "My Account" and your information will be displayed to you and you can make additions or corrections as needed. With this system, you can print your own replacement cards if you lose yours.

VA Home Loan Program

The VA Home Loan Program Reform Act authorizes the VA to create a "permanent partial claims program" that gives Veterans a second chance to stay in their homes. Thousands of financially distressed Veterans using the VA Home Loan Guaranty Program who are at risk of foreclosure will become eligible for federal assistance to cover their mortgage under this new program signed into law in July by President Trump that allows them to defer monthly mortgage payments temporarily without losing their homes. Under the program, the VA buys a portion of the Veteran's debt and secures a lien on the property. The legislation is intended for homeowners struggling to rebound from financial setbacks, such as a job loss or high medical bills. The Veteran does not have to pay off the claim until the home is sold or refinanced. The legislation passed unanimously in the House and Senate. The bill also enables the VA to continue funding not-for-profit community agencies that run homeless prevention programs that provide transitional housing and services for Veterans experiencing homelessness through the Homeless Providers Grant and Per Diem Program. The American Legion supported this bill. "This critical legislation represents a profound commitment to safeguarding the financial security and dignity of Veteran homeowners" sid James LaCoursiere, National Commander of The American Legion.

There are a couple items I would like to address in this newsletter. Recently, a ruling at the National level stated that disaster relief will not be provided to Sons of The American Legion (SAL) members. The American Legion Department of Florida, however, has assured us that the Sons of The American Legion Detachment of Florida will never be forgotten. The Office of the National Judge Advocate recently shared an opinion outlining the Four Rules governing all American Legion programs — including the Sons of The American Legion. Here's how Squadron 316 meets each rule:

Rule #1, Leadership — All elected and appointed leaders must be confirmed by the parent organization after each selection, or as needed. After each election our new officers are installed by the District Installation Team

Rule #2, Rules – All bylaws, amendments and/or standing rules must be presented to the parent organization for confirmation and approved prior to use. Squadron 316 Constitution and Bylaws were approved and signed by Department Commander Clarence Hill 14 April 2003

Rule #3, Reports – The program will provide to the parent organization: (a) monthly activities reports; (b) quarterly financial reports; (c) an annual financial statement; and (d) any additional report(s) requested by the parent organization. As Squadron Commander I fill out a monthly report covering those items and present it to the Post Commander via the Executive Board.

Rule #4, Controls — The parent organization may provide the program with the EIN and tax-exemption status, with the necessary financial controls over their usage. All program financial accounts must have a minimum of two signatories appointed by the parent organization. Squadron 316 Finance Officer is a dual member of both the Legion and the Squadron. The Post Commander has full access to the Squadron financial accounts. Fost 316 has extended their EIN to cover the Squadron financial accounts.

In Summary: In my opinion, Squadron 316 is fully in compliance with all Four Rules of an American Legion Program. Until notified otherwise, we will continue to operate as we currently do — proudly and properly.

BE THE ONE Campaign

At the Spring NEC meetings this past May, the NEC passed Resolution 13: Be the One Days to provide a new method for raising awareness of the Legion's "Be the One" veteran suicide-prevention initiative. The Resolution urges American Legion Family members and American Legion posts to set aside the first day of each month as an opportunity to reduce the stigma around mental health issues. Legion Family members are urged to wear a "Be the One" item to signal their commitment to the initiative. This can be a great way to keep awareness high about this important issue all year long. Resolution 7 passed at the same Conference establishes the last Saturday in April as "American Legion Family Day" and encourages posts to open their doors to their community with the intent to educate, recruit, recognize and give back to those members who support the post and to place special emphasis on "Be the One."

New American Legion App

The American Legion has launched a new mobile membership app—Legion+ which can be downloaded through Apple iTunes and the Google Play. store. Legion+ provides a direct route for members to access their digital membership card, manage membership information, recruit new members, help a suicidal veteran and get the latest news on legion.org. The new app includes these channels: Home and News: A list of the latest American Legion news head-lines; **Recruit**: A QR code appears that takes potential members to legion.org/join; Be the One: Features the ability to call the 988 Veteran's Crisis Line, follow QPR (question, persuade, refer) suicidal training and listen to Be the One podcast episodes. Other key features include: A digital membership card (top left corner icon) with current status and number of consecutive years; **Member**ship Account (top right corner icon) with membership card, personal contact information, branch of service, service era, post and depart-ment contact information and more. More features will be added in the future such as the ability to send Post notifications to members, approve new members, and access Buddy Check rosters, Post Data Reports and Consolidated Post Reports.
